

## Response to question on notice

### Questions on Notice Paper No 11

### Question No. 669

**Mr Thomas Emerson MLA:** To ask the Minister for City and Government Services

1. How many street signs in the electorate of Kurrajong are due, or overdue, for renewal or replacement.
2. How many of the renewals or replacements referred to in part (1) will be actioned in 2025-2026.
3. How many signs are due or overdue for renewal or replacement on Canberra's Main Avenues and Approach Routes (NCA Designated Areas).
4. How many of the renewals or replacements referred to in part (3) will be actioned in 2025-2026.

**TARA CHEYNE MLA** - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

1. Signs do not have a lifecycle or expiry date and so it is not possible for signs to be due or overdue for renewal.

They are replaced as required, taking into account competing priorities and availability of funding. There are currently 80 active work orders in the Roads ACT asset management system for general sign repairs/replacement in the suburbs within the electorate of Kurrajong.

2. Roads ACT expects to complete the vast majority of these work orders within FY25/26, with regulatory signs and school area signage taking priority for installation.
3. There are presently 49 signs being renewed on Canberra's Main Avenues and Approach Routes.
4. All of them are planned to be delivered in FY25/26.
