RESPONSE TO QUESTION ON NOTICE Questions on Notice Paper No 4 21 March 2025 Question No. 242

MS MORRIS: To ask the Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Services — In relation to the numbers provided in the response to question on notice No 32 asked during the inquiry into annual and financial reports 2023–2024, of the 744 sworn police officers, how many are currently on longterm leave (a) of six weeks or more, (b) for the leave type of (i) workers compensation and (ii) personal leave.

MARISA PATERSON MLA - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

- As at 26.03.2025, ACTP had a total of 52 sworn members on long-term leave of twelve weeks or more.
- This broken down by category is as follows:

Category	Count
Workers Compensation	17
Long Service Leave/ Long Term Leave	22

- ACT Policing reporting is set up to flag long term leave as equal to or greater than twelve weeks.
- In order to provide statistics on members on long term leave of six weeks or more, a manual report would need to be requested from National Workforce Analytics which would need a time frame of two weeks minimum.
- This timeframe does not include additional manual work that would need to be further undertaken to complete this request.
