RESPONSE TO QUESTION ON NOTICE Questions on Notice Paper No 6 9 May 2025 Question No. 358

Asked by Mr Emerson MLA -

- 1. What is the average wait time for a probationary drivers licence test through Access Canberra.
- 2. When the wait time is over three months, are learners still able to book in for a probationary license test; if not, what do they do.
- 3. When will the Government move from a phone call based booking system to a self-service online booking system for probationary license tests.

Ms Cheyne MLA - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

- 1. The current wait time for a driver licence test with an ACT Government Driver Licence Examiner is approximately 7 weeks.
- 2. The average wait time over the last six months has not exceeded three months. In the event that this occurs, Access Canberra has a 'wait list' process. As an alternative to the driver licence test clients have the option to undertake the driver licence competency based (logbook) assessment with a non-Government Accredited Driving Instructor.
- 3. No decision has been made to move to an online booking system.
