## Questions on Notice Paper No 11 25 September 2025 Question No. 676

MR SHANE RATTENBURY MLA: To ask the Minister for Homes, Homelessness and New Suburbs

- 1. In how many matters has Housing ACT engaged the ACT Government Solicitor to represent them at the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal over the last 3 years, broken down by each year?
- 2. How much did this cost for each of the years referred to in part (1)?

MS YVETTE BERRY MLA - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

- The number of matters in which the ACT Government Solicitor's Office (ACTGSO) has represented Housing ACT at the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal (ACAT) by financial year is as below:
  - 2022-23 10 matters
  - 2023-24 22 matters
  - 2024-25 16 matters
  - 2025-26 (to 30 September 2025) 8 matters

And breakdown by calendar year is as below:

- 2022 10 matters
- 2023 10 matters
- 2024 25 matters
- 2025 (to 30 September 2025) 15 matters

Please note, above counts do not include instances where the ACTGSO has assisted in Tribunal matters but not provided representation, for example, lodging an application or providing advice on prospects of an application.
