## **RESPONSE TO QUESTION ON NOTICE Questions on Notice Paper No 4** Friday, 21 March 2025 Question No. 231

Mr. Rattenbury MLA: To ask the Minister for Homes and New Suburbs

- 1. How many Housing ACT properties have just one gas appliance.
- 2. What considerations have been made to phasing out gas appliances, given that a single appliance would require the tenant to pay over \$300 a year in gas supply charges.
- 3. How and how often does Housing ACT undertake regular inspection and testing of gas appliances.

**Yvette Berry MLA** - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

- Approximately 1,500 Housing ACT properties have one gas appliance as of 31 December 2024.
- 2. While the primary focus of the Home Energy Support: Public Housing Program is on ceiling insulation, approximately 1,800 public housing properties are expected to be electrified by 2026, with over 880 properties upgraded as of 31 December 2024.
  - The ACT Government has made a further commitment through the Integrated Energy Plan to electrify all feasible public housing homes by 2030.
- 3. There is no requirement under the Residential Tenancies Act 1997 to inspect/test gas appliances in the ACT. When tenants raise work requests, repairs and maintenance are completed by qualified contractors; this includes testing following installations or repair.
