DEBORAH MORRIS MLA: To ask the Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Services — In relation to action 5.6 on page 46 of the Strategic Bushfire Management Plan 2019-2024, can the Minister provide a list of all current pre-suppression fire plans active in the ACT.

DR MARISA PATERSON MLA - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

Pre-Incident Operational Plans are reviewed or developed for key areas of the Territory to assist ACT Fire & Rescue, and the ACT Rural Fire Service to respond to bushfires. The current list of Pre-Incident Operational Plans in the ACT are:

In addition, the ACT Parks and Conservation Service within the City and Environment Directorate maintains a Pre-Suppression Atlas for land under their custodianship. The Pre-Suppression Atlas is a ready index that is distributed to each bushfire appliance in the ACT along with Incident Management Teams. The Pre-Suppression Atlas contains information that supports bushfire response including:

- Roads and Fire trails including their classification for different fire vehicles and names
- Gates that access different areas
- Locations of important environmental values including rare plants
- Locations of important cultural heritage objects
- Identification of critical infrastructure for city operations and public safety
- Identified hazards like known un-exploded ordinance areas and high energy emitters such as
 Tidbinbilla Deep Space Tracking and Comms centre
- Locations of remote helipads
- Exclusion areas for firefighting chemicals where they could impact sensitive environments.
