RESPONSE to QUESTION ON NOTICE Questions on Notice Paper No 36 27 October 2023 Question No. 1487

MRS KIKKERT: to ask the Minister for Police and Emergency Services —

- (1) How many drug related incidents were recorded by ACT Policing, broken down by type of offence and drug(s) involved, between 1 January 2022 to 28 October 2023.
- (2) How many individuals possessing illicit drugs were charged or fined, between 1 January 2022 to 28 October 2023.
- (3) How many individuals possessing a small amount of illicit drugs that is decriminalised in the ACT, were charged or fined, between 1 January 2022 to 28 October 2023.
- (4) How many individuals possessing illicit drugs were not charged or fined and instead directed to rehabilitation services, between 1 January 2022 to 28 October 2023.
- (5) How many individuals possessing a small amount of illicit drugs that is decriminalised in the ACT were not charged or fined, between 1 January 2022 to 28 October 2023.

MR GENTLEMAN MLA - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

Between 1 January 2022 and 28 October 2023, there were 179 drug related incidents
reported to ACT Policing. Table 1A provides a breakdown by reported incident type. These
incidents resulted in either a drug related offence being reported and/or a drug related
charge which resulted from the incident.

There is no way of accurately linking the drug quantities with a possession charge in the Police Real-time Online Management System (PROMIS), therefore ACT Policing is unable to ascertain if the charge was for a 'small amount' without performing a significant manual interrogation of the entire dataset.
- 4. Between 1 January 2022 and 28 October 2023, there were 315 apprehensions containing a drug possession related charge where the charge was cleared by diversion.
