RESPONSE TO QUESTION ON NOTICE Questions on Notice Paper No 8 Friday, 27 June 2025 Question No. 493


MR CAIN: To ask the Minister for City and Government Services —

- 1. Has the ACT Government conducted any traffic or safety studies on Bowman Street West in the past two years.
- 2. Can the Minister advise why speed bumps have not been implemented on Bowman Street West.
- 3. Has the ACT Government undertaken any pedestrian or traffic safety assessments between the Southern Cross Club and Jamison Plaza in the past two years.
- 4. Will the Government consider installing a zebra crossing to improve pedestrian safety and access between the Southern Cross Club and Jamison Plaza.
- 5. What criteria does the ACT Government apply when determining the need for pedestrian crossings.

Ms Tara Cheyne MLA – The answer to the Member's questions are as follows:

- 1. Yes, the ACT Government has undertaken traffic surveys (vehicle speed and volume data) in 2024, as well as an investigation into pedestrian safety across Bowman Street.
- 2. A concept design for speed humps has been considered. The location of bus stops, side access roads and other road features is a key consideration.
- 3. No
- 4. This location is unlikely to meet the criteria for a formal priority (zebra) crossing.
- 5. Roads ACT considers national assessment criteria which takes into consideration the number of vehicles and pedestrians at a particular location. The minimum criteria to be met for a formal priority crossing to be considered is the presence of 60 pedestrians and 600 vehicles in each of two separate one-hour periods.
