Asked by Mr Peter Cain MLA -

- 1. How many fixed cameras does the ACT Government have on ACT roads, as at 1 January 2025.
- 2. Which directorates and/or agencies operate the fixed cameras referred to in part (1), broken down by individual directorate and/or agency.
- 3. How many fixed cameras did the ACT Government have on ACT roads, as at 1 January 2018.
- 4. Which directorates and/or agencies operated the fixed cameras referred to in part (3), broken down by individual directorate and/or agency.

Ms Cheyne MLA - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

- Information on the ACT road safety camera program is publicly available on the Access Canberra
 website, including the number and location of redlight, fixed and mobile speed cameras. This
 information can be found at: <u>ACT road safety camera program Access Canberra</u>.
 Information regarding the number and location of Public Safety CCTV is published online. This
 information can be found here.
 - The Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) traffic signals team operate a total of 132 traffic monitoring cameras across 118 sites (as of 1 January 2025).
- 2. Access Canberra manages the fixed redlight and speed cameras, as well as the Mobile Device Detection Cameras (MDDC).
 - TCCS operates traffic monitoring cameras.
 - The Justice and Community Safety Directorate manages the Public Safety CCTV Network.

- 3. Fixed and redlight camera numbers in 2018 are the same as 2025 numbers. Mobile device detection cameras were introduced in the ACT in 2024.
 - The TCCS traffic signals team operated nine traffic monitoring cameras at nine sites in 2018.
